I will learn to...

Maths

- explore ways in which 10 can be composed of 2 parts
- solve problems involving the composition of 10
- identify pairs of numbers that make 10
- identify whether numbers are before or after 5 on the number track
- describe and follow the rules for simple, linear track games

- record weather observations
- locate and describe places that are shady, damp and cold
